

Alberto Martini to Receive Award For Advancing Rigorous Evaluation of Social Programs

The University of Maryland is pleased to announce a special award to Alberto Martini of the Università del Piemonte Orientale, Alessandria, Italy, for advancing the cause of rigorous evaluation of social programs. The award is being made in recognition of Professor Martini's leadership in encouraging the highest standards of causal inference research, both in his home country of Italy and in Europe generally.

The award ceremony will be held in the building of the Italian Senate, Palazzo Madama, sala Koch, on July 11, 2017, at 11 a.m. The award will be conferred by the President of the Italian Senate, Mr. Pietro Grasso.

After receiving a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin, and stints at Mathematica Policy Research and the Urban Institute, Alberto has had a distinguished career in Italy, including being the president of the Italian Evaluation Society. (See attached bio.)

The award is being made with the advice of the award committee for the Peter H. Rossi Award for Contributions to the Theory or Practice of Program Evaluation.
